




Why Amoli?

Most women become victims of human trafficking when they are coerced into slavery or slavery-like conditions through the deceptive practices of friends, family members, spouses and businesses and/or their recruitment agents. They prey on individuals who are socially or economically marginalized and systemically oppressed.

If a victim's socioeconomic vulnerabilities are not addressed, a survivor may easily find themselves in the same precarious financial situation they experienced prior to exploitation.

Now, with the added challenges of complex trauma, the bias of a criminal justice system that too often fails to protect survivors, and other systemic barriers to recovery it becomes easier to fall back.

The psychological and physical impacts of having survived human trafficking affect a person's entire life. Inclusive workplaces can help survivors of any traumatic experience assert their autonomy and empower themselves.

Businesses can support in the empowerment of survivors through partnerships with organizations that support survivors, and by offering safe and long-term employment.

Businesses that seek to advance a strategy to support survivors are encouraged to partner with as well as financially support organizations that provide vital services to survivors across a range of needs.



What is Amoli?

Amoli Handicrafts (www.amoli.store) is a Social Enterprise employing survivors of human trafficking.


We support survivors to achieve economic security and autonomy, thus reducing the risk that they or their dependents will be re-exploited in the future.

Our partner NGO, Purnata (meaning "wholeness" or "completion") has a unique Rehabilitation and Reintegration program that helps begin a journey of healing and hope.

On completion of the program, we provide them jobs that help them live lives of dignity.

At **Amoli**, the women find motivation, challenge and freedom, helping them become independent women with a career.

Purnata has trained over 15 women in the last few years of which 4 are employed by **Amoli.**

Mr. Aaboo Varghese, the Founder of Purnata, realised the need for gainful employment for survivors of Human Trafficking and decided to start **Amoli** Handicraft along with a colleague, Mr. Earnest Dcosta.


Amoli seeks to empower the women who have been trafficked in red light areas. We intend to provide a holistic environment where they can strive for excellence and live with dignity.

The word "Amoli" is inscribed into the face of the woman representing

Amoli Handicrafts.

If you notice, her mouth is open. It symbolises the fact that once she was voiceless but now through a life of dignity and empowerment, she has a voice. She can speak up for herself and be an agent of change.

The pink/magenta dot on the ear represents a full stop.

The colour is feminine symbolising the majority, if not all, of our artisans are women survivors of human trafficking or vulnerable to it.

The logo is a symbolic outline of a strong woman who is willing to speak up to transform her life and gain success.





What's unique about us?

Our Products




